

## BUDAPEST SHORT FACE TUMBLERS

In Germany, Middle and East Europe, and the United States called  
Short Beaks

**ORIGIN:** Budapest, Hungary. Since 1968 all colors, markings, and patterns  
in one Standard.

**General Impression:** Small, slender, graceful. Front of the body carried  
proudly erect. Therefore, the bird is sloping including  
the tail. Broad, sharp featured head deepening in the  
middle of the crown: bulging eyes, broad cere, short  
beak, standing on tip toes, lively temperament.

### STANDARD

**Head:** Forehead broad and steep. Breadth of the forehead and length of  
the head are equal. The rear of the head is smaller, higher,  
overreaching the crown and sharply sloping. Therefore, the line of  
the crown tilts towards the lower forehead with the dent on its  
middle. Eye arches are parallel and extruding.

**Eyes:** Big, bulging, with large pupils: Iris grey blue, fine grained.  
White specimens as well, only in the Gansel is it dark black blue.  
The eye cere is wide, smooth, tight, in the black beak varieties  
it is dark blue and in the light beak varieties it is lemon yellow.

**Beak:** Fitted right angled into the forehead, short, thick, blunt, well  
closed. Black variants have black beaks, and light variants have  
wax colored or flesh beaks. Wattles are small.

**Neck:** Relatively long, slender, third part of upper rear slightly  
outward curved.

**Breast:** Not too broad, rounded, carried upright.

**Back:** Small, rounded, falling downward.

**Wings:** Slender, not too long, well folded resting on the tail. Wing  
butts protruding slightly.

**Tail:** Narrow, not too long, sloping in line with the back.

**Legs:** Middle long, clean legged. The nails are black in the black  
variants and wax or flesh colored in the light beak variants.

**Plumage:** Tight, dense, firm on the body,

## COLOR

### I. With Black Beaks

- a. **Selvs:** Black.
- b. **Barred:** Blue, Checkered blue, dark storked, grizzle.
- c. **With Marking:** Storked.

### II. With Light Beaks.

- a. **Selvs:** Black, white, yellow, red, dun, silver.
- b. **Barred:** Blue checkered blue. light checkered. mealv. cream, faded yellow, silver, ash red generally called strawberry.
- c. **Markings:** Ganseled, Whiteflighted in all the above colors.

## COLOR AND MARKING

- Dark Storked:** Basic color is a light blue grey. wings even lighter. somewhat "clouded". black bars. under belly white, neck dark grey with green violet lustre.
- Storked:** Basic color white, tips of flights grey black fading out, white tail.
- Blue:** Not too dark blue.
- Whiteflights:** The same as the selfs. but 3-5 primaries white on each side.
- Ganseled:** White are the head, bib until the middle of the front of the neck. wings, back, belly, and thighs. Colored are the back of the neck as high as possible, lower part of the front of the neck, breast, shoulder and tail.

## MAJOR FAULTS

Coarse body. head without tyne. eye arches not parallel. ruddy eyes, red ceres in the light beak variants and light ceres in the black beak variants. beaks too long. thin. sharp. or crossed. Short. thick neck. dropped wings, low posture. long flight or tail feathers, split eyes.

## Judging

After the general impression. details are in the following order of importance: Shape of head and its proportions: eyes- arches. color, cere. beak - shape and fitting, figure of the body and carriage, neck, stance, color and marking.

Rich and with an even lustre.
